# June 4, 2025 Martyrs of Uganda (translated) 9:30 am Wednesday Eucharist

The peoples of what is now Uganda lived in a highly sophisticated society comprised of a federation of tribes under a hereditary monarch, the Kabaka. When European explorers and Christian missionaries entered the region in the 1860s, the Bugandan people were receptive to their teachings. The Kabaka, however, feared the growing strength and influence of foreigners. A vicious persecution began in 1885, culminating in the killing of Anglican and Roman Catholic converts at Namugongo on June 3, 1886. Their witness proved to be "the seed of the Ugandan church", and by Uganda's independence in 1962 it was the most Christian nation in Africa. The Church's strength and resistance to the terror and corruption of Idi Amin's overthrow of the government in 1972 brought more persecution. When Anglican Archbishop Janani Luwum formally protested the injustices, he was murdered in 1977. Today we remember those whose love and witness for Christ gives us courage to speak up and resist evil in our times.

May we who cherish their remembrance before you be valiant in our witness against the terrors of unjust rulers, and remain steadfast in the love by which you bind us to yourself; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy

Spirit, one God now and forever. Amen.

#### THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

The First Reading: Hebrews 10:32-39

Reader: A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews,

<sup>32</sup> But recall those earlier days when, after you had been enlightened, you endured a hard struggle with sufferings, <sup>33</sup> sometimes being publicly exposed to abuse and persecution, and sometimes being partners with those so treated. <sup>34</sup> For you had compassion for those who were in prison, and you cheerfully accepted the plundering of your possessions, knowing that you yourselves possessed something better and more lasting. <sup>35</sup> Do not, therefore, abandon that confidence of yours; it brings a great reward. <sup>36</sup> For you need endurance, so that when you have done the will of God, you may receive what was promised. <sup>37</sup> For yet 'in a very little while, the one who is coming will come and will not delay; <sup>38</sup> but my righteous one will live by faith. My soul takes no pleasure in anyone who shrinks back.'<sup>39</sup> But we are not among those who shrink back and so are lost, but among those who have faith and so are saved.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Presider: Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; you are glorified in the assembly of all your saints. All your martyrs bless you and praise you, confessing before the powers of this world the great name of your only Son. Therefore we join our voices with theirs, and with all who have served you in every age, to proclaim the glory of your name:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

Presider: We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, Father, according to his command,

All: we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;

Presider: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

All: Amen.
