#### Collect of the Day

Presider: Let us pray,

All: God of the dispossessed,

you teach us to hunger for justice even when the weak are shut out

and the powerful turn over in their beds:

in the heat of our anger

and the bitterness of our complaints,

give us courage to protest,

the persistence to pray and the heart to love; through Jesus Christ, the true judge. Amen.

The Epistle: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:5

Reader: The Epistle is taken from the Second Letter to Timothy,

<sup>14</sup> But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, <sup>15</sup> and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. <sup>16</sup> All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, <sup>17</sup> so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

**4** In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: <sup>2</sup> proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. <sup>3</sup> For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound

doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, <sup>4</sup> and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. <sup>5</sup> As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

#### Gradual Psalm:119:97-104 Quomodo dilexi!

- <sup>97</sup> LORD, what love have I unto thy law! / all the day long is my study in it.
- <sup>98</sup> Thy commandment maketh me wiser than mine enemies; / for it is ever with me.
- 99 I have more understanding than all my teachers; / for thy testimonies are my study.
- <sup>100</sup> I have more discernment than the aged; / because I keep thy precepts.
- 101 I have refrained my feet from every evil way, / that I may keep thy word.
- 102 1 have not shrunk from thy judgements; / for thou teachest me.
- 103 O how sweet are thy words unto my throat,/ yea, sweeter than honey unto my mouth!
- 104 Through thy precepts I get understanding: / therefore I hate all evil ways.

The Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Presider: The Lord be with you, **All:** and with thy Spirit.

Presider: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. <sup>2</sup> He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. <sup>3</sup> In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "Grant me justice against my opponent." <sup>4</sup> For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, "Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, <sup>5</sup> yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming." <sup>6</sup> And the Lord said, 'Listen to what the unjust judge says. <sup>7</sup> And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? <sup>8</sup> I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'
