THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

The First Reading: Daniel 7:1-3 & 15-18

Reader: A reading from the prophet Daniel,

In the first year of King Belshazzar of Babylon, Daniel had a dream and visions of his head as he lay in bed. Then he wrote down the dream: ²I, Daniel, saw in my vision by night the four winds of heaven stirring up the great sea, ³and four great beasts came up out of the sea, different from one another.

¹⁵ As for me, Daniel, my spirit was troubled within me, and the visions of my head terrified me. ¹⁶ I approached one of the attendants to ask him the truth concerning all this. So he said that he would disclose to me the interpretation of the matter: ¹⁷ ‘As for these four great beasts, four kings shall arise out of the earth. ¹⁸ But the holy ones of the Most High shall receive the kingdom and possess the kingdom for ever—for ever and ever.’

Reader: Holy Word, Holy Wisdom.

All: Thanks be to God.

The Psalm: 149

¹ Hallelujah! Sing to the Lord a new song; *
sing the praises of God in the congregation of the faithful.

² Let Israel rejoice in their maker; *
let the children of Zion be joyful in their sovereign.

³ Let them praise the name of the Lord in the dance; *
let them sing praise to God with timbrel and harp.

⁴ For the Lord takes pleasure in this people *
and adorns the poor with victory.

⁵ Let the faithful rejoice in triumph; *
let them be joyful on their beds.

The Second Reading: Ephesians 1:11-23

Reader: A reading from the Letter to the Ephesians,

¹¹In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹²so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

¹⁵I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love towards all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. ²⁰God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²²And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

²⁷ 'But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸ bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. ²⁹ If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. ³⁰ Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. ³¹ Do to others as you would have them do to you.

The Prayers of the People

Leader: Guide your Church to follow the examples of all your saints through the ages, and to witness with joyful praise and reverent worship. We lift up to you those people in our lives who have shone with the light of Christ for us... (pause here)
... May all our ministers, lay leaders, and people know that they are called to holiness. Lord, in your mercy,

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: Sanctify all human striving towards a better world, that all may work together for good. We ask you to bless our prime minister Mark, our M.P. Jake, our premier David, our M.L.A. Jennifer, our mayor and council, and all chiefs and hereditary leaders. Give wisdom to all in authority, to learn from those who in the past have governed with justice and mercy. Lord, in your mercy,

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: In all our families, work, service, and friendships, help us to share the grace which we see in the lives of your saints. Bless our community with servants for your work, that we may be a light of belonging and love to the wider neighbourhood. Lord, in your mercy,

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: Have compassion on those who labour for righteousness' sake. We remember the unsung saints of health-care workers, emergency responders, transportation workers, trades, and services in our community. Lord, in your mercy,

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: Open the path of light for all who are afflicted in body, mind, or spirit. We pray for the healing of Garry, Marilyn, and those we name silently or aloud at this time... (pause here)
... May they be comforted by your presence in those who tend to them. Lord, in your mercy,

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: We give thanks for all who have died but left us a pattern of holy living. Today we give thanks for the lives of Michael, Richard, and Goncalina, and all we will honour in our All Souls service this evening. Give us grace to honour their memory not only with our lips, but in lives that make us worthy to come with them to eternal life in the heavenly glory. Lord, in your mercy,

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: We who feebly struggle, while they in glory shine, ask for your forgiveness. We have failed to see you in our neighbours, and to respond in loving care to the needs around us. We repent of our sins, known and unknown, and pray your Holy Spirit to create clean hearts within us so that we may be sanctified. Lord, in your mercy,

All: Hear our prayer.

Leader: May our prayers be accepted in the name of Christ who calls us to be saints.

All: Amen.

Presider: Blessed are you, gracious God, Creator of heaven and earth; in the multitude of saints you surround us with so great a cloud of witnesses, that we, rejoicing in their fellowship, may run with patience the race that is set before us, and together with them receive the crown of glory that never fades away. Therefore with angels and archangels and with all who have served you in every age, we raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name:

**All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might.

Presider: We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, Father, according to his command,

**All: we remember his death,
we proclaim his resurrection,
we await his coming in glory;**

Presider: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine. We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

All: Amen.
