All: Jesus Christ is the light of the world!

Will you travel by the light of the babe new born? In the candle lit at night there's a gleam of dawn, And the darkness all about is too dim to put it out: Will you hide, or decide to meet the light?

THE CHRISTMAS STORY

Narrator: Listen now to the story of Christmas. I wonder what we will see and hear and touch and taste tonight? This night is special. It is like no other night. It is time to dream and sing our way to Bethlehem. The children will show us the way. The little town we seek sits in the hill country some ten miles south of Jerusalem. For thousands of years the houses have gathered there on the hilltop like a family breaking bread together. 'Bethlehem' means "House of Bread."

In the centre of the village is a small inn. On this night it is overflowing with people seeking sleep and a place to eat. Behind the inn is a dark stable. A horse chews his oats while a cow leans and rests after the day's plowing in the valley. A sheep nearby is nearly asleep. All is still and quiet in the little town.

Would all children holding animals please bring them forward...

Carol: O Little Town of Bethlehem (Blue Hymnbook #120)

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie. Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by. Yet in thy dark street shineth the everlasting light: The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.

For Christ is born of Mary; and gathered all above, While mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love. O morning stars, together, proclaim the holy birth, And praises sing to God the King, and peace to all the earth.

Narrator: As night gathers, the last two travelers come slowly up the road. Look there is a young woman about to be a mother. She is walking with her husband. They are Joseph and Mary from Nazareth! The have walked for six days to come to this city where King David was born so long ago. They have come, like many others, because the Roman Emperor wants to count each one, so that he can take their money as a tax. But it is late, and Mary is so weary. Where will they sleep? There is no room in the inn. They decide to sleep with the animals.

Would the children holding Mary and Joseph please bring them...

Carol: Once in Royal David's City (Blue Hymnbook #123)

Once in royal David's city stood a lowly cattle shed, where a mother laid her baby in a manger for a bed. Mary was that mother mild, Jesus Christ her little child.

He came down to earth from heaven who is God and Lord of all, and his shelter was a stable, and his cradle was a stall. With the poor and mean and lowly, lived on earth our Saviour holy.

Not in that poor lowly stable, with the oxen standing by we shall see him, but in heaven set at God's right hand on high. When, like stars, his children crowned all in white shall gather round.

Narrator: Stars brighten slowly in the sky. All creation holds its breath.

Suddenly, from the stable, comes the cry of a newborn child!

Mary gently wraps the baby in a blanket and lays him in the feed box that his father has filled with straw.

Would the child holding Jesus please bring him up...

Carol: Away in a Manger (Blue Hymnbook #126)

Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, The little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head. The stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay, The little Lord Jesus, asleep on the hay.

The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes, But little Lord Jesus no crying he makes. I love you, Lord Jesus- look down from the sky And stay by my side until morning is nigh.

Narrator: In the hills outside Bethlehem, shepherds watch their shadowy sheep. All at once, the dark is lost in light, and in the midst of the light is something even brighter: the faces of angels. The fearful shepherds then hear music in the sky, and a voice says clearly, "Do not be afraid. Listen, I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by all people. Today in the city of David a Savior is born! He is Christ, the Lord." Then more angels appear, a whole heavenly host of them, praising God and singing: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will to all people, everywhere." The shepherds run with joy across the fields to Bethlehem to the

barn behind the inn. There they find the Holy Family and creep forward, overwhelmed with mystery, to find the Nativity itself in the centre of all that love.

Would the angels and shepherds please come forward...

Carol: While Shepherds Watched (Blue Hymnbook #136)

While shepherds watched their flocks by night, All seated on the ground, The angel of the Lord came down And glory shone around.

"Fear not", said he, for mighty dread Had seized their troubled mind. "Glad tidings of great joy I bring To you and humankind."

Narrator: Three camels plod up the road to Bethlehem. They have some from the East, far beyond the Arabian Desert, perhaps from as far as the Caspian Sea. The camels carry three kings, the wise ones, the Magi. They are following the wild star, the destiny they had never seen before, and they are following it, wherever it goes, to find the King shown to them by the shining star.

Would the kings please come forward with their gifts...

Carol: We Three Kings

We three kings of Orient are bearing gifts, we traverse afar. Field and fountain, moor and mountain, following yonder star:

O, O- star of wonder, star of light, Star with royal beauty bright, Westward leading, still proceeding-Guide us to thy perfect light. Narrator: The king's journey ends when they find this the new kind of king. Their restlessness rests at last. They fall to their knees and give him bright gold, sweet-smelling frankincense and bitter myrrh, brought so far with so much love.

So now we all come, following the star, to find God with us. We come, as people have some all through the ages, to bring our own gifts to this Child, God's gift to us.

Come forward and bring your stars to place on our Christmas tree. Show us the way into the Mystery of Christmas, as we sing, for this night is holy and filled with over-flowing love.

Round yon virgin mother and child,


